Complaint:

The formal complaint from Georgia State University alleged that on November 18, 2017, two Georgia State University students were taken to Dahlonega, Georgia by members of Kappa Sigma Fraternity, had their cell phones taken, and were left in Dahlonega to find their way back to Atlanta.

The alleged violations of Georgia State University's Student Code of Conduct Section II General Conduct Policies and Procedures included:

II. General Conduct Policies and Procedures

A. Prohibited General Conduct

5. Threatening physical abuse, intimidation, coercion and/or conduct which threatens the health or safety of others.
16. Engaging in, supporting, promoting or sponsoring hazing (see the Hazing Policy).

Results:

The Student Judicial Board held a disciplinary hearing on Friday, April 13, 2018. Based on the information and evidence presented at the judicial hearing, the Student Judicial Board found the **Epsilon-Omega of Kappa Sigma Fraternity** not responsible for the violations listed above. The Dean of Students upheld the findings of the Student Judicial Board.
